## Big Red Returns From Break With Big Test At Bucknell

*Cornell returns from 18-day break to face perennial Patriot League challenger*

ITHACA, N.Y. — An 18-day break for final exams comes to an end for Cornell when it visits Bucknell at Sojka Pavilion on Wednesday, Dec. 19 at 7 p.m. The game will be broadcast live on 1160 ESPN Radio with Barry Leonard providing the call. You can also listen on the internet as part of the RedCast subscription service at CornellBigRed.com.

Cornell enters the contest after nearly three weeks of studying, papers and exams, but also of practicing and improving after beginning the campaign 4-2, the team's best six-game start in 11 years. Despite the early success, the Big Red will have had plenty of time to stew over a 76-73 loss to Colgate in its final game before break. After going for its best start in nearly 40 years, the defeat gave Cornell an opportunity to refocus with the start of Ivy League play exactly a month away from the Bucknell game.

Sophomores Ryan Wittman (15.3 ppg., 5.7 rpg.) and Louis Dale (14.5 ppg., 7.3 apg., 4.8 rpg.) continue to lead the Big Red offense, which is averaging 83 points per game. Junior Collin Robinson has also had a major impact off the bench in his first six games after transferring from USC. The 6-0 guard is averaging 13.0 points, 5.7 assists and 2.7 rebounds as a reserve, averaging 28 minutes per game. Another transfer, 7-0 center Jeff Foote from St. Bonaventure, will also make his collegiate debut against the Bison.

Bucknell enters the contest with a 3-5 record after dropping an emotional 72-56 decision over Wake Forest on Sunday. Bucknell got 16 points from John Griffin as assistant coach Mark Prosser returned to the school his late father coached at before his untimely passing prior to the 2006-07 season.

**ABOUT BUCKNELL:** The Bison are off to a 3-5 start after a 72-56 loss at Wake Forest on Dec. 16. John Griffin leads the squad at 13.6 ppg., while Patrick Behan (11.8 ppg.) is also in double figures. Defensively, Bucknell is again among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense, limiting teams to .396 shooting from the floor and .303 from 3-point range. Head coach Pat Flannery, in his 14th season on the Bison sideline, has posted a 225-164 in Lewisburg and a 320-207 mark in 19 seasons as a head coach.

**CORNELL VS. THE PATRIOT LEAGUE:** The Big Red holds a 134-110 all-time record against current members of the Patriot League, including a 21-21 mark against Bucknell. The Big Red has faced Army (20-13), Colgate (70-53), Holy Cross (2-3), Lafayette (7-11), Lehigh (12-8) and Navy (2-1). This is the last of four scheduled games Cornell will play against Patriot League foes in 2007-08, with Cornell posting an 87-83 win over Lehigh in the season opener and topping Army 93-78 on Nov. 20, then falling at home to Colgate by a 76-73 margin on Dec. 1.

**A WIN OVER BUCKNELL WOULD ...**

- make Cornell 5-2 overall.
- snap a four-game skid to Bucknell and give Cornell a 22-21 edge in the series.
- make the Big Red 3-1 against teams from the Patriot League.

**DALE NAMED IVY LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Nov. 26):** Dale helped Cornell to wins over Army and Siena, averaging 18.5 points, 6.5 assists and 6.5 rebounds in the two games. He shot 48 percent from the floor, 55 percent from 3-point range and on 9-of-11 free throws (82 percent). Dale opened the week with 17 points, seven assists and four rebounds in a 93-78 win over the Black Knights. The 5-11 guard was even better as Cornell topped the preseason Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference favorite Saints, going for a season-high 20 points and nine rebounds, along with six assists in the 83-77 victory. Dale scored 15 of his points in the second half, ending the evening 4-of-6 on 3-pointers.

**JOINING US ... NOW:** Junior Jeff Foote, a 7-0 center who transferred from St. Bonaventure mid-season last year, will be eligible to compete for the Big Red beginning on Dec. 19 at Bucknell after fall final exams have been completed. Foote, who hails from nearby Lockwood, N.Y., will be Cornell's second seven-footer, joining Marshall Werner '93.

**NOVEMBER REIGN:** Cornell closed out its first winning month of November since 1998 with its victory over Siena, finishing with a 4-1. That 1998-99 team went 3-2 in November en route to an 11-15 finish. The four wins in November is a school record.

**TREY BIEN:** The Big Red has hit at least one 3-pointer in 511 straight games entering the Bucknell contest. Cornell surpassed the 500-game plateau when the Big Red connected on six treys at Princeton on Feb. 16, 2007. The last time Cornell did not hit a 3-pointer was against Denison in the 1988-89 season opener (0-for-2). Since the 3-point shot came into effect in NCAA play during the 1986-87 season, Cornell has hit at least one shot behind the arc in 562 of 566 games, connecting on 3,210 treys, an average of 5.67 per game. The Big Red has hit a 3-pointer in all 197 games coached by Steve Donahue.

**TREY BIEN, MERCI:** The Big Red opened the season with four consecutive games in which it has hit at least 10 3-pointers, the longest stretch in school history. Cornell had never previously gone more than two consecutive games with 10 or more treys. The Big Red has reached double figures in 3-point field goals in five of six games this year.

**THREE IS MY FAVORITE NUMBER:** Through six games, Cornell leads the country in 3-point field goal percentage (.480), ahead of second-place Colgate (.458). The Big Red is also 14th in 3-pointers per game (9.8).

ITHACA, N.Y. -- Donald Brown made two big shots in the final two minutes and sophomore Jason Vegotsky put Bucknell ahead for the first time in the second half with his 3-pointer with 42 seconds left to lift the Bison to a 70-66 win over Cornell. Brown made 6-of-8 shots and ended with 14 points to lead four Bison in double figures. He added a team-high five rebounds, three assists and two steals in the victory. Vegotsky and John Griffin each added 12, while Justin Castleberry notched 11. Bucknell's pair of All-Patriot League seniors, Abe Badmus and Chris McNaughton, tallied just nine points and had six turnovers. Cornell's Louis Dale had a career-high 23 points to go along with seven rebounds and six assists in the loss. Dale hit on 11-of-12 free throws and 5-of-8 field goals overall. Ryan Wittman chipped in with 11 points and Andrew Naeve had 10 points and seven boards.

**THE BIG ASSIST:** Sophomore Louis Dale ranks fourth nationally in assists at 7.3 apg. (through 12/4), a mark that would establish a school record of 197 if he maintains his current pace. Roger Chadwick had 171 assists during the 1951-52 campaign.

**PICKING UP THE PACE:** Cornell enters the Bucknell game just off a school-record scoring pace. The Big Red is averaging 83.0 points per game through six contests, just below the 85.2 points the 1965-66 squad averaged en route to a 15-9 season.

**CRUISING AT 80:** The Big Red scored at least 80 points in four straight games to open the year, the first time it had reached that mark consecutively since the 1966-67 squad had five straight under head coach Sam MacNeil (110 vs. Pitt, 80 vs. Yale, 81 vs. Brown, 86 at Dartmouth, 85 at Harvard).

**LINE IT UP:** The Big Red got to the free throw line 38 times in the win over Army, making 31 attempts from the charity stripe. It was the most makes in a single game for Cornell since hitting 31 at Harvard during the 1992-93 season. For the year, Cornell is connecting on 76 percent of its shots from the free throw line.

**BIG RED PICKED FIRST IN PRE-SEASON POLL:** If the Ivy League media are right, the Cornell men's basketball team will be the conference's representative when the 2007-08 NCAA basketball tournament comes around, as head coach Steve Donahue's team opens the season sitting atop the Ivy League media preseason poll which was released today by the

league office. The Big Red is the first team other than Penn or Princeton to sit atop the preseason poll since Dartmouth was predicted to win the 1988-89 campaign 19 years ago. The Big Red received 10 of 16 first-place votes and outdistanced projected runner-up Yale, 119-104. Three-time defending league champion Penn, with 97

points, finished third, while Columbia (80), Brown (70), Harvard (43), Princeton (40) and Dartmouth (23) rounded out the eight-team field. Yale was the top team on three ballots, while Penn, Columbia and Brown each received one first-place vote.

**LAST IVY TITLE:** Cornell is the last team other than Penn or Princeton to earn the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. The Big Red went 11-3 in Ivy League play and 17-10 overall during the 1987-88 season, running off 11 straight conference wins at one point during the year. Cornell faced Arizona in the first round of the national tourney, dropping a 90-50 decision. That team is here for men's basketball Alumni Weekend on its 20th anniversary of that special season.

**TALL IVY:** Over the last three seasons, Cornell's 25-17 record is second-best among Ivy League teams in conference action. Penn has claimed each of the last three Ancient Eight titles and has posted a 36-6 mark in conference over that span.

**BIG RED RECEIVES VOTES IN PRESEASON MID-MAJOR TOP 25 POLL:** Cornell received 25 votes in the preseason collegeinsider.com Mid-Major top 25 poll, placing itself in the others receiving votes category. Non-conference foe Siena is ranked No. 22, while Bucknell (61), Penn (33), Ohio (27) and Yale (5) joined the Big Red in the also receiving votes category. The Mid-Major Top 25 includes teams from the America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Continent, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Sun Belt and West Coast Conference.

**DALE DISHES IT OUT:** Sophomore Louis Dale has improved upon a tremendous freshman season by becoming a true point guard as a sophomore. Through six games, Dale is averaging 7.3 assists per game. He opened the season with a career-high 10 in the win over Lehigh, then posted nine to just two turnovers against Ohio. Dale is averaging 14.5 points and 7.3 assists to go along with 4.8 rebounds on 50 percent shooting overall and 52 percent from 3-point range. Dale is also making 88 percent of his free throws. He had a dominant 20-point, nine-rebound, six-assist effort in the win over Siena, helping him earn Ivy League Player of the Week honors.

**WITTMAN LIGHTS IT UP:** Sophomore Ryan Wittman, picked by many publications as a preseason first-team All-Ivy League selection, has shown why people think so highly of him early in the season. Wittman is averaging 15.3 points and a team-best 5.7 rebounds while shooting 54 percent from the floor and 61 percent from 3-point range so far in 2007-08. He notched 17 points and four rebounds at Ohio after hitting on 5-of-6 3-pointers in the opener vs. Lehigh. He has made a 3-pointer in all 34 of his college contests entering the Bucknell game and became the 12th player in school history to surpass 100 career 3-pointers with his second make at Ohio. Wittman had 14 points and a career-high 11 rebounds in a win over preseason MAAC favorite Siena and a

13-point, eight-rebound effort vs. Binghamton. His 17 points came on 5-of-7 3-point shooting against Colgate.

**ROBINSON PROVIDES BIG SPARK:** Few, if any, Ivy League teams can boast a player like Collin Robinson coming off the bench. The junior, who transferred to Cornell from USC, is averaging 13.0 points, 5.7 assists, 2.7 rebounds and

1.5 steals in six games as a reserve this season. Robinson had a career-high 16-point, six-assist, four-rebound game in a win over Army. He also had 10 points, five assists and three rebounds at Ohio and 14 points, seven assists and two steals vs. Siena. Robinson is earning starter's minutes, averaging 29.0 minutes per game, second on the team.

**HARTFORD HEALTHY AND MAKING AN IMPACT:** Senior Jason Hartford is averaging 9.8 points and 4.2 rebounds while making 6-of-11 3-pointers so far this season. Hartford had 19 points, seven rebounds and two blocks in the season-opening win over Lehigh, then followed that up with 18 points at Ohio against the Bobcats' formidable frontline. Hartford sat out the entire 2006-07 season with a myriad of injuries, earning a fifth year from the Ivy League.

**GORE BACK ON THE ATTACK:** Junior guard Adam Gore's return from last season's knee injury has gone smoothly, with the former Ivy League Rookie of the Year averaging 8.8 points, 2.5 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.2 steals per game so far this season. Gore had 12 points, three rebounds and three assists at Ohio in just his second game back after missing the final 27 contests a season ago.

**BIG MAN IN THE POST:** Sophomore Alex Tyler has been the Big Red's physical presence in the post this season, averaging 8.2 points and 4.3 rebounds. Tyler had 13 points to go along with six rebounds at Ohio after opening the 2007-08 season with eight points, seven rebounds and two blocks against Lehigh in his first collegiate start. He has twice matched his career-high of seven rebounds in a game, and established a career scoring high with 16 points (8-of-11 shooting) vs. Colgate.

**KREEF GETS SALUTE:** Some players just seem to play better against certain teams. Junior forward Brian Kreefer must circle Army on his calendar every year. After playing a total of three minutes in the team's first two contests this year, Kreefer scored a team-high 21 points and added three assists, two rebounds and two steals in 25 minutes, continuing his excellent play in his career against the Black Knights. Kreefer is averaging 17.7 points while shooting .704 from the floor (19-of-27) and .636 from 3-point range (7-of-11) in three games against Army. This season, Kreefer is posting 9.2 ppg. and 2.8 apg., while shooting 70 percent from the floor (19-of-27).

**WILKINS BRINGS THE EXCITEMENT:** Sophomore Andre Wilkins, a transfer from Blinn College, has already become a fan favorite at Newman Arena thanks to his hustle and athleticism. He has also been a key player off the bench for the Big Red, averaging 3.7 points and 2.3 rebounds. He made his Cornell debut against Lehigh, posting nine points, six rebounds and two steals in 25 minutes off the bench. Wilkins had six points and five rebounds in the win over Army.

**WITTMAN A PRESEASON MID-MAJOR ALL-AMERICAN:** Sophomore Ryan Wittman was named a preseason Mid-Major All-American by collegeinsider.com. He was the only sophomore and one of just three underclassmen on the 25-man squad. Wittman is also the only Ivy League representative.

**GETTING UP THERE:** Cornell head coach Steve Donahue enters the 2007-08 campaign with the second-longest tenure at the helm of their current team in the Ivy League. Only James Jones at Yale (ninth year) has been at his current school longer than Donahue has directed the Big Red.

**CAPTAINS' COUNCIL:** The Big Red men's basketball team will be led by a captains' council group this season, who will share regular captain's duties. Senior Jason Hartford

Kampmann helped the 2006-07 Hobart squad to an 11-14 mark and a 7-7 conference record in 2006-07, helping the team improve throughout the season. The Statesmen won their final four games and five of their final six games overall. He helped in the development of first-team all-league selection John Grazioli and second-team pick Mike Manning. Prior to his stint at Hobart, Kampmann spent the 2005-06 season as an assistant coach at Williams. While at Williams, Kampmann helped the Ephs to a 17-8 record while working primarily with the perimeter players. He also served as head coach of the junior varsity program.

**ASSORTED NOTES:**

- Seven members of this year's squad earned first-team all-state recognition in high school. ### THE ROBERT E. GALLAGHER '44 HEAD COACH OF MEN'S BASKETBALL

Steve Donahue enters his eighth season as head basketball coach at Cornell and his energetic leadership has helped the Big Red basketball program gain a new level of national respect and become a perennial challenger for the Ivy League title.

A tremendous motivator, Donahue has set lofty goals for his program. While continuing its move up the Ivy League standings is the immediate challenge, building a program that can compete for Ivy League titles and NCAA berths is the main focus. His team has the second-best Ivy record over the last three years (25-17).

In each successive season, the quality of play by the Big Red has steadily improved. Donahue has coached and/or recruited six of the school's top 20 all-time leading scorers, three Ivy League Rookie of the Year players, four Academic All-District picks and two Academic All-Americans.

Coming off a 16-12 season in 2006-07, the first winning campaign for the Big Red since 1996-97, Cornell has high expectations with the return of eight of the squad's top 10 scorers and three All-Ivy players (Louis Dale, Adam Gore, Ryan Wittman). Last year's squad posted a 9-5 Ancient Eight record, the most conference wins since 1992-93, while the team finished in the top three in the league standings for the third straight season. The team closed the season 12-5 after the calendar turned to 2007.

Donahue's 2005-06 team matched the previous season's win total both overall (13). Cornell finished in third place in the final league standings as both Lenny Collins and Adam Gore earned second-team All-Ivy honors, while Gore was named the Ivy League Rookie of the Year.

The 2004-05 Ivy League Coach of the Year according to CollegelInsider.com, Donahue's Big Red squad earned its highest Ivy finish in 17 years with its second-place effort and claimed its first winning Ancient Eight campaign (8-6) since the 1992-93 season. It was only the seventh time in school history that Cornell finished second in Ivy play.

In 2003-04, Donahue led a team with just one senior to its third straight season of improvement. The 11 wins overall were the most by a Big Red team in five years, as were the club's six Ivy wins. Cornell improved its scoring average nearly 10 points per game, went from a -3.0 to a +2.3 rebound margin and lowered its opponent field goal percentage (ranking

second in Ivy League play at .426). Cornell's pressure defense generated 236 steals, good for second in the Ivy League and a school record.

Donahue developed Ka'Ron Barnes into a first-team All-Ivy selection in 2004, the Big Red's first player to be honored as one of the league's top five players in seven seasons.

Donahue's 2002-03 squad nearly doubled its previous season's win total with its 9-18 finish, while its fifth-place ranking in the Ivy League was its highest since 1999. Barnes was named second-team All-Ivy League, while Lenny Collins earned the Ancient Eight's Rookie of the Year Award.

Off the court, Cornell players are expected to succeed in the classroom and contribute in their community. Big Red players make appearances in local schools, speaking to students of the importance of a good education.

Donahue became the fourth Robert E. Gallagher '44 Coach of Men's Basketball at Cornell on Sept. 6, 2000. He wasted little time making an impact on and off the court.

Despite joining the program a little more than two months before the team's first contest in 2000, Donahue began molding his team. By the end of the season his emphasis on hard work and dedication to the program paid off in a win over Ivy League champ and NCAA participant Princeton and a two-point loss to league runner-up Penn.

Donahue led a team that relied on eight freshmen, the most of any Division I school in the country, to a nearly identical record as in his first season in 2001-02. The team's biggest improvement could be seen in its defensive play, as the squad lowered its field goal percentage defense from .463 in Donahue's first season to .428 in his second year.

Renowned as a top recruiter and for his offensive mind while an assistant at the University of Pennsylvania, Donahue learned the trade from some of the

nation's top coaches.

Donahue served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Fran Dunphy at Penn for 10 years. During his tenure as a Quaker assistant, he was heavily involved in the recruitment of five of Penn's top 20 all-time scorers. He was also instrumental in the Quakers winning six Ivy League titles in his last eight years there, advancing to the NCAA tournament five times and earning national recognition with a top 25 ranking.

Prior to joining Dunphy's staff at Penn, Donahue coached for two seasons at Philadelphia University. During his two seasons there, the Rams won 20 games each season and also competed in the 1989 NCAA Division II tournament. He has the unique experience of qualifying for the NCAA tournament in all three divisions (including the Division III tourney as a player with Ursinus).

Donahue served as an assistant for current Lafayette head coach Fran O'Hanlon at Monsignor Bonner High School, helping to guide Bonner to the 1987-88 Philadelphia Catholic League Championship.

Donahue began his coaching career at Springfield HS under Skip Werley, his former college coach.

It was during his playing days at Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pa., that Donahue developed his leadership skills. He captained both the baseball and basketball teams as a senior, earning four letters in both sports. As a freshman, Donahue helped the basketball squad finish 23-8 and advance to the NCAA Division III tournament.

A 1984 graduate of Ursinus with a bachelor of arts degree in economics and business administration, Donahue is currently working on his master's degree in organizational dynamics at the University of Pennsylvania.

Donahue and his wife, Pamela, reside in Ithaca with their four children, Taylor, Matthew, Katie and Jack.

## CORNELL VISITS FRANCE (MAY 23-JUNE 1, 2007)

Entering a season many feel could be a breakthrough campaign for the Big Red men's basketball program, head coach Steve Donahue and his Cornell squad embarked on a 10-day trip to France for team bonding, cultural sharing and competition. By the end of the trip the seeds for a championship run had been planted.

Cornell's second foreign trip in program history was a successful one, as a party of 12 players, coaches and support staff competed in three games and took in some of the most beautiful and historic sights in the world.

Cornell saw action against three French teams, as well as the Luxembourg national squad, during its time in Europe, providing the young Big Red team some much-needed extra experience. Cornell traveled with a roster of 12 that includes two seniors (Khaliq Gant, Jason Hartford), four juniors (Adam Gore, Brian Kreefer, Conor Mullen, Collin Robinson) and six sophomores (Louis Dale, Jon Jaques, Geoff Reeves, Pete Reynolds, Alex Tyler and Ryan Wittman). Dale (groin), Gant (neck), Gore (knee) and Hartford (foot) did not play in the games as they continued to recover from various injuries, but were still able to enjoy the visit overseas. Unfortunately, juniors Jason Battle and Jeff Foote were unable to make the trip. Battle found out the morning of the trip that he would not be able to travel due to sickness, while Foote was forced to stay back due to transfer ineligibility with the NCAA. Both players worked out with the team in the week prior to taking the transatlantic flight.

"This trip will be a tremendous experience for all involved," said head coach Steve Donahue prior to leaving. "Not only does it give us a chance to enjoy each other without the pressures of school and work that will allow us to continue to build chemistry, but it also gives us a chance to take the court for additional practice and game situations. It allows everyone to play and gain experience. We have had such young players in key roles for us the past two years that many forget we are still a very young team. I think this trip will go a long ways in helping us continue our learning curve."

The trip began with an overnight flight from John F. Kennedy Airport in New York City on the evening of May 23, landing in Paris at approximately 10 a.m. local time the following day. The Big Red had a chance to relax and explore the "City of Light" before a team Welcome Dinner. The Cornell team spent day two sightseeing, with a bus tour and an extended visit to the Louvre. The group also split up with various people hitting Notre Dame Cathedral, the Eiffel Tower and the Champs d'Élysees.

That evening, Cornell had its first chance to hit the hardwood, dropping a 77-76 contest to the Paris Under-20 team. Rising sophomore Ryan Wittman had 19 points and classmate Geoff Reeves had 18, but Paris scored with 4.8 seconds remaining and a last-second Cornell jumper rimmed out as time expired.

Day four (May 26) gave the Big Red a chance for more competition.

After an afternoon to again explore Paris, Cornell picked up its first win of the trip, topping Eveil Sportif D'Ormes of the French N2 league by a 94-79 margin. Six players reached double figures with Wittman leading the way with 25 points. Cornell shot 55 percent in the first half while stepping up in competition against a French "A" National league team, a third division professional team. Wittman made 10-of-21 shots from the floor and 5-of-12 3-pointers. Junior Collin Robinson added 16 points, six assists, four rebounds and three steals for his second consecutive strong effort running the point. Rising sophomore Alex Tyler had 12 points and eight rebounds despite battling foul trouble, while Pete Reynolds had 11 points, seven rebounds and two steals.

Cornell headed from Paris to Lyon, France's third-largest city, on May 27. The following day, the group continued south for Aix-en-Provence, heading through the French countryside en route. Once there, Donahue's squad used a strong defensive effort in the first half and showed off its offensive prowess after halftime in a 98-91 victory over Sapela Basket 13. Robinson dominated on both ends for the Big Red with a trip-best 28 points and seven assists. Wittman had 18 points, six assists and four rebounds and Brian Kreefer notched 17 points and eight rebounds.

The eighth day of the trip featured a swing down the coast to Nice on the French Riviera. A day there to rejuvenate and practice, as well as a dip in the Mediterranean Sea, led to the final game on Thursday, May 31, closing the month with a contest against the Luxembourg National Team. In a physical, tightly contested game throughout, Luxembourg defeated Cornell, 94-85. The Big Red, playing with just eight student-athletes, was in foul trouble throughout the game and couldn't overcome a 17-point first half deficit in the loss. Robinson ended the game with a team-best 22 points and seven assists and added six rebounds in the loss, while Wittman netted 20 points and had two steals. Conor Mullen had seven rebounds and four steals in the loss.

The trip ended the following day as Cornell flew from Nice to Paris and then on to New York City.

NCAA rules limit member schools to one foreign trip every four years, allowing schools to gain not only a competitive opportunity, but also a chance for a cultural opportunity the student-athletes may never otherwise experience.

This won't be the last foreign trip for the Big Red men's basketball program. Donahue, along with help from former coach Scott Thompson and the athletic alumni affairs and development office, have secured funds to endow the trip, meaning that every four years Cornell basketball players will be circling the globe.

## 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE 1987-88 IVY CHAMPIONSHIP & NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAM

With apologies to Charles Dickens, it was a tale of three seasons for the 1987-88 Cornell men's basketball team.

At the start of the season, the Big Red opened 4-1. After the holiday's, Cornell struggled, losing six of its next nine contests. But after a near-disastrous loss at Lafayette, Cornell reeled off 11 consecutive wins to streak to its first Ivy League championship in 34 years.

Talent. This team had it. Experience. The Big Red had seven seniors who knew what it would take to capture an Ancient Eight crown. Perseverance and character. The two ingredients that this team found, making it a championship season.

After struggling through the mid-portion of its season, Cornell opened Ivy league play with a 97-83 loss to preseason favorite Dartmouth. A win over Harvard the following night at home set up what would be the turning point of the season — an 84-43 defeat at Lafayette. Not only was the 41-point loss the worst for Cornell in seven years, but it looked as if the wheels had completely fallen off.

To steal a football phrase, it was now "gut-check time" for Cornell. It all started with a 73-60 triumph over Columbia, setting up a six-week win fest that included 11 consecutive victories. Included among the

wins were at Columbia for just the second time in 18 years, a sweep of Princeton and Penn at home and a 101-85 triumph at Dartmouth in a showdown of the first and second place teams in the Ivy League.

Despite losses in its final two regular season games, a Dartmouth loss to Yale gave an 11-3 Big Red squad a spot in the NCAA tournament - collegiate sports' biggest showcase. And the excitement grew even more when the pairings were announced - Cornell vs. Arizona in Los Angeles.

Pauley Pavilion on the campus of UCLA. To most of the team members, this conjured up memories of playing on the same floor that John Wooden made legendary. A chance to play in a basketball shrine.

It came as no surprise to anyone that the Big Red fell to an Arizona team, an eventual Final Four squad led by future NBA star Sean Elliott, 90-50. But the Big Red represented the Ivy League well that day, both on and off the court.

Perseverance and character.

That will be the lasting memory of the 1987-88 Big Red. When given the chance to fold up their tents, this team reached back for that something extra. It dared to dream and was rewarded for its efforts. It was the Ivy League champion.

Alex Tyler (13 points, six rebounds), Adam Gore (12), Louis Dale (11 points, nine assists) and Collin Robinson (10 points) also hit double figures. He was part of a bench effort that combined for 45 points, 16 rebounds and 11 assists on the afternoon. Jason Battle and Andre Wilkins provided energy and defense, each posting five rebounds, an assist and a steal without a turnover. The regulars also added to the win. Ryan Wittman also hit for double figures, adding 13 points and eight rebounds. Brian Kreefer had seven points and three assists, with Alex Tyler posting six points and seven rebounds in just 16 minutes of action. Devon McBride scored a game-high 20 points off the bench for the Bearcats to lead four players in double figures. Lazar Trifunovic notched 16 points and Moussa Camara had 12 points. Robinson also handed out a game-high nine assists, while Dale tied for the team-high with five rebounds and added seven assists, four steals and a blocked shot. The Raiders were led by Kyle Roemer and Daniel Waddy with 18 and 16 points, respectively, while Willie Morse chipped in 11 points.
